What's 'Occurring' in Wales?

In Wales, we continue to deliver safely and successfully with essential support from our procurement team and supply chain partners.

Major schemes for Transport for Wales such as the Ebbw Vale Frequency Enhancement scheme and Cardiff Bay, Butetown station both schemes required supply chain engagement and support for the work from civils and earthworks to platform construction.

Severn Estuary Earthworks required timely deliveries of fuel, water, grout and mesh during a three-week blockade in August 2023. Phase 2 continues with work due to finish in March. During the blockade, we used the opportunity to carry out work at Chepstow Bridge replacing a bridge abutment. This was supplied as a precast unit with our procurement and design team working together to sign off for just-in-time delivery to the site.

Our emergency team was called upon to work during the Christmas break on the complex junction at Shrewsbury station. The bridge repair works were planned, and materials were procured over a short three-week period to enable successful delivery.

In April 2024 we're due to start the Network Rail CP7 buildings and civils framework with the first scheme deliveries due to start in June 2024. We've already started engaging with suppliers to support delivery of the work.











In December we held our annual foodbank collection, using our community impact days to volunteer at the foodbank helping to sort and pack the donations.

We look forward to using more of our community impact days in 2024 on activities with our supply partners as we did in 2023 at Cannington School, Sprotborough Locks, and litter picking days.
